8	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•sequences information and ideas logically•manages all aspects of cohesion well•uses paragraphing sufficiently and appropriately

Band	Coherence and Cohesion
7	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•logically organises information and ideas; there is clear progression throughout•uses a range of cohesive devices appropriately although there may be some under-/over-use•presents a clear central topic within each paragraph

6	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•arranges information and ideas coherently and there is a clear overall progression•uses cohesive devices effectively, but cohesion within and/or between sentences may be faulty or mechanical•may not always use referencing clearly or appropriately•uses paragraphing, but not always logically

5	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•presents information with some organisation but there may be a lack of overall progression•makes inadequate, inaccurate or over use of cohesive devices•may be repetitive because of lack of referencing and substitution•may not write in paragraphs, or paragraphing may be inadequate

4	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•presents information and ideas but these are not arranged coherently and there is no clear progression in the response•uses some basic cohesive devices but these may be inaccurate or repetitive•may not write in paragraphs or their use may be confusing

3	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•does not organise ideas logically•may use a very limited range of cohesive devices, and those used may not indicate a logical relationship between ideas

2	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•has very little control of organisational features
1	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•fails to communicate any message

Band	Lexical Resource
9	•uses a wide range of vocabulary with very natural and sophisticated control of lexical features; rare minor errors occur only as ‘slips’

Scoring

Band	Lexical Resource
8	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•uses a wide range of vocabulary fluently and flexibly to convey precise meanings•skillfully uses uncommon lexical items but there may be occasional inaccuracies in word choice and collocation•produces rare errors in spelling and/or word formation

Band	Lexical Resource
7	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•uses a sufficient range of vocabulary to allow some flexibility and precision•uses less common lexical items with some awareness of style and collocation•may produce occasional errors in word choice, spelling and/or word formation

6	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•uses an adequate range of vocabulary for the task•attempts to use less common vocabulary but with some inaccuracy•makes some errors in spelling and/or word formation, but they do not impede communication

5	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•uses a limited range of vocabulary, but this is minimally adequate for the task•may make noticeable errors in spelling and/or word formation that may cause some difficulty for the reader

4	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•uses only basic vocabulary which may be used repetitively or which may be inappropriate for the task•has limited control of word formation and/or spelling; errors may cause strain for the reader

3	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•uses only a very limited range of words and expressions with very limited control of word formation and/or spelling•errors may severely distort the message

2	•uses an extremely limited range of vocabulary; essentially no control of word formation and/or spelling
1	•can only use a few isolated words

Band	Grammatical Range and Accuracy
9	•uses a wide range of structures with full flexibility and accuracy; rare minor errors occur only as 'slips'

Scoring

Task 2

Band	Grammatical Range and Accuracy
8	uses a wide range of structures the majority of sentences are error-free makes only very occasional errors or inappropriacies

Scoring

Task 2

Band	Grammatical Range and Accuracy
7	uses a variety of complex structures produces frequent error-free sentences has good control of grammar and punctuation but may make a few errors

Band	Grammatical Range and Accuracy
6	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•uses a mix of simple and complex sentence forms•makes some errors in grammar and punctuation but they rarely reduce communication

Scoring

Band	Grammatical Range and Accuracy
5	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•uses only a limited range of structures•attempts complex sentences but these tend to be less accurate than simple sentences•may make frequent grammatical errors and punctuation may be faulty; errors can cause some difficulty for the reader

Band	Grammatical Range and Accuracy
4	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•uses only a very limited range of structures with only rare use of subordinate clauses•some structures are accurate but errors predominate, and punctuation is often faulty

Band	Grammatical Range and Accuracy
3	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•attempts sentence forms but errors in grammar and punctuation predominate and distort the meaning

Strategies

- Read the instructions carefully
- Take some time to plan the content and structure of your essay
- You need an introduction, more than 1 body paragraph, and a conclusion (4-5 paragraphs total)
- The introduction should paraphrase the question
- Use formal language instead of casual language
- Be sure to manage your time
- Leave time to proofread

General Tips

- Only give your opinion if they ask for it
- Don't support all sides of an argument if they ask you to choose one
- If you're taking the paper based test, don't spend time counting the words on test day
 - Practice writing on test paper and see how many words you generally write on each page
- Don't use slang or very casual vocabulary
- Avoid repetition

Other ways to prepare

- Write as much as possible
- Read as much as possible, especially if you don't have someone to correct your writing
- Read sample essay questions and answers
- Learn vocabulary relating to the types of questions on the test
- Practice, practice, practice
